Bemis Center Announces 2025 International Artists-in-Residence

Renowned Program Welcomes 35 Artists from Across the Globe

OMAHA, Neb. (March 12, 2025) — <u>Bemis Center for Contemporary Arts</u> has selected 35 artists from 14 states and eight countries for its 2025 international Residency Program. Recognized among the leading residency programs globally, Bemis provides artists with unparalleled resources and a vibrant community for creative exploration in the heart of downtown Omaha, Nebraska.

For over four decades, Bemis Center has championed artists by providing uninterrupted time and space — along with critical financial and human resources — for the creation of new work. Bemis's Residency Program fosters experimentation and risk-taking across all disciplines, including visual arts, sound, and curatorial practice. Artists-in-residence are appointed a private live/work studio and have 24-hour access to extensive installation and production spaces; the Okada Sculpture & Ceramics Facility, a 9,000 square foot industrial workshop used for large-scale sculpture fabrication; and a Sound Studio for rehearsing and recording, among other amenities.

Selected residents will participate in one of four tracks: Artist-in-Residence, Sound Art + Experimental Music Artist-in-Residence, Alumni Artist-in-Residence, and Curator-in-

Residence. Last year's Open Call drew 1,361 applications — a record for Bemis — demonstrating the program's continued demand among artists worldwide.
