Omaha, Nebraska — One of the only nonprofit venues in North America dedicated to experimental music turns five years old this fall. LOW END, located on the south end of Bemis Center's campus (724 S. 12th St.), opened its doors on October 25, 2019 with an inaugural performance by indie rock/experimental pop band Deerhoof. The venue has since welcomed more than 4,600 in-person attendees and more than 20,000 digital viewers to experience 90 performances. To celebrate this milestone, Bemis Center will present a concert series reprising some of the program's earliest performers and release a limited-pressing vinyl record highlighting select artists, titled 5 Years @ LOW END.
